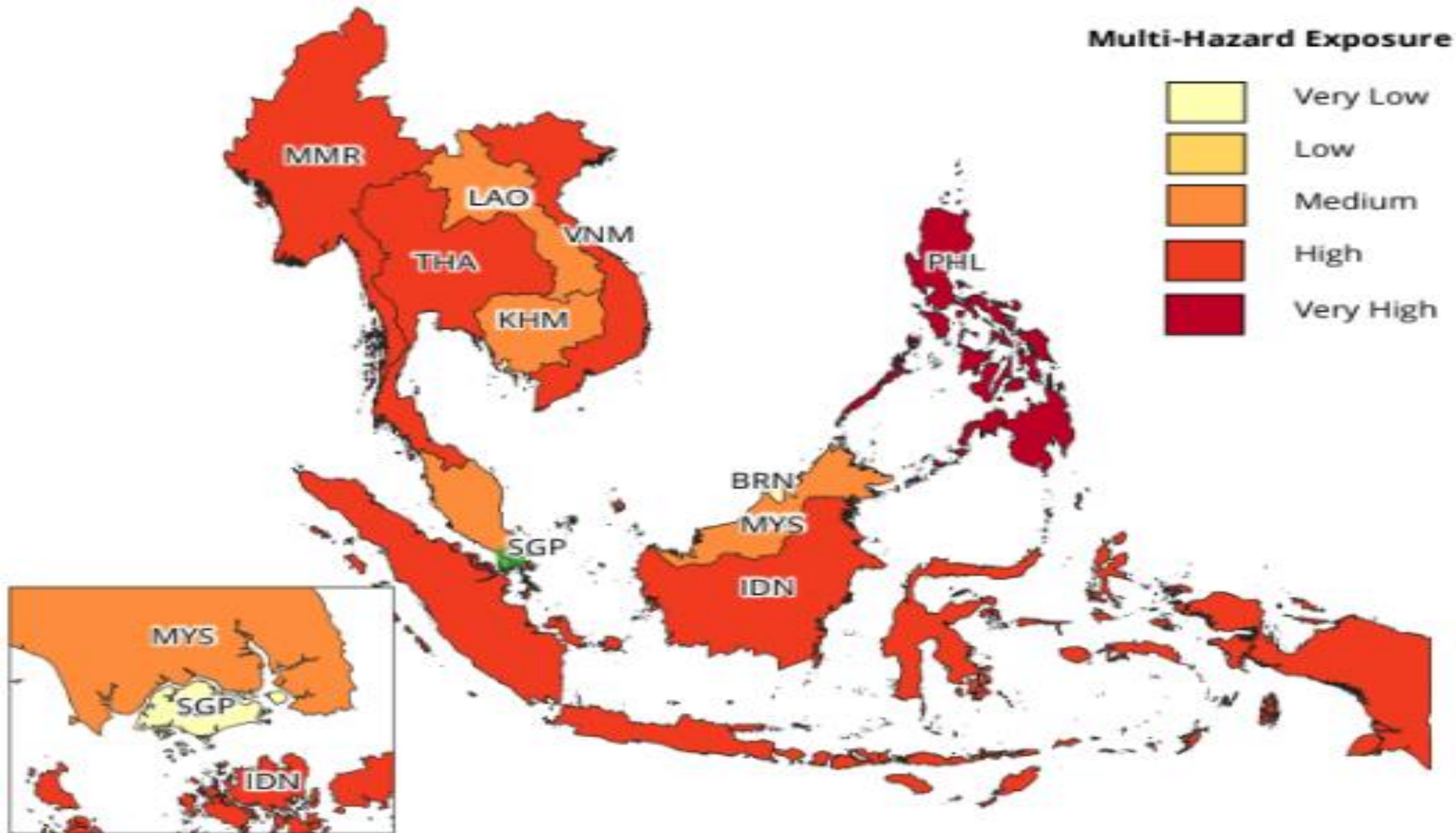

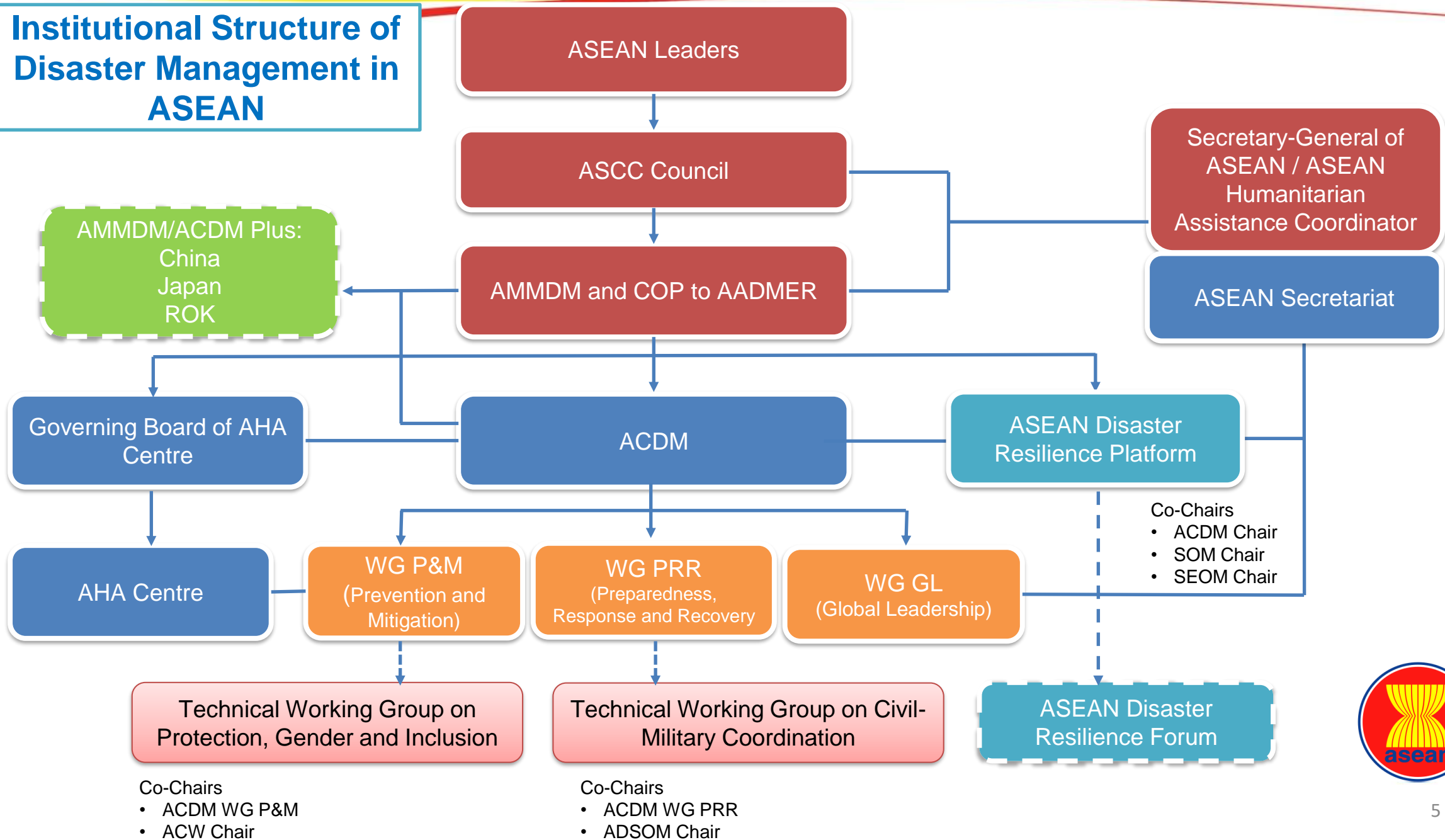




Institutional Structure for ASEAN Disaster Management Sector



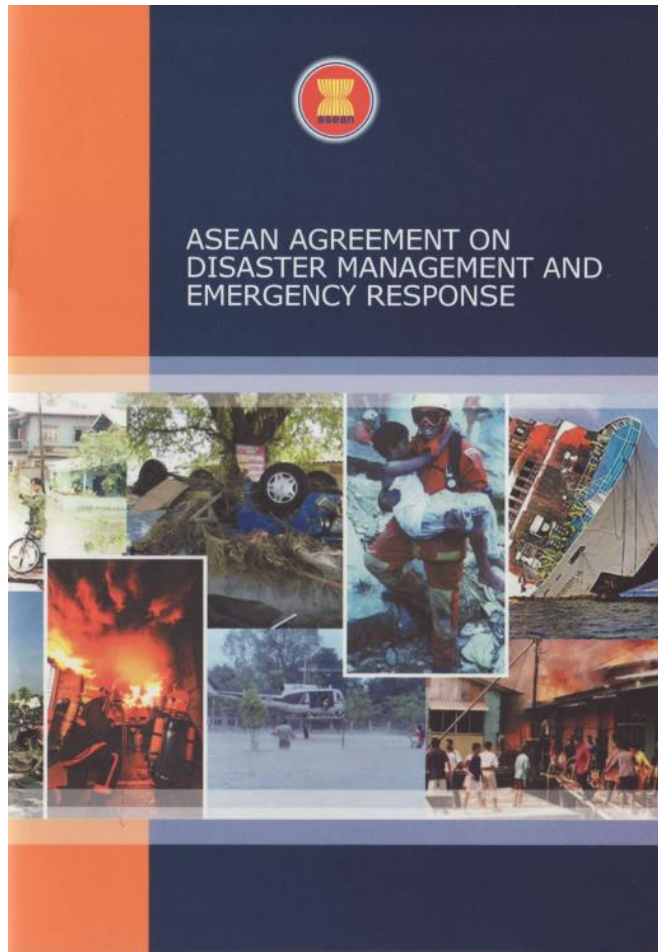
Institutional Structure of Disaster Management in ASEAN

ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER)



- The ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER) was signed by the ASEAN Foreign Ministers in July 2005 and entered into force in 2009.
- **This binding agreement is the regional policy backbone for ASEAN** which sets the foundation for regional cooperation, coordination, technical assistance, and resource mobilisation in all aspects of disaster management and emergency response.

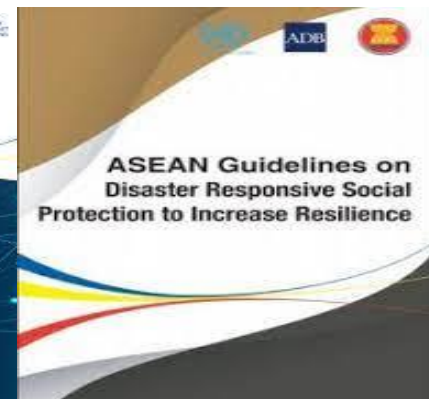
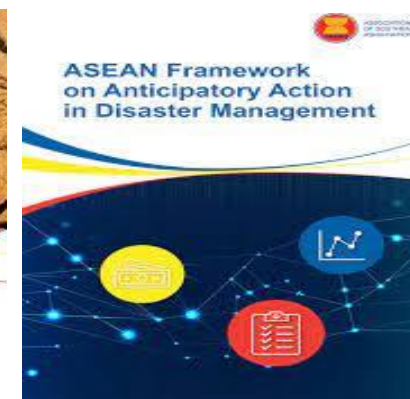
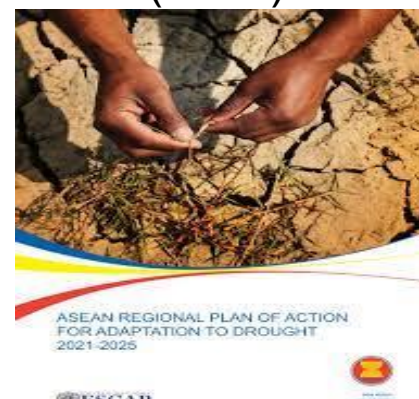
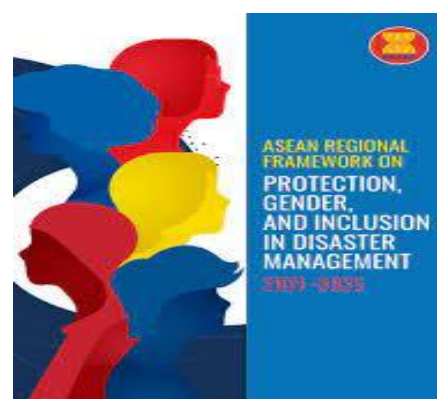
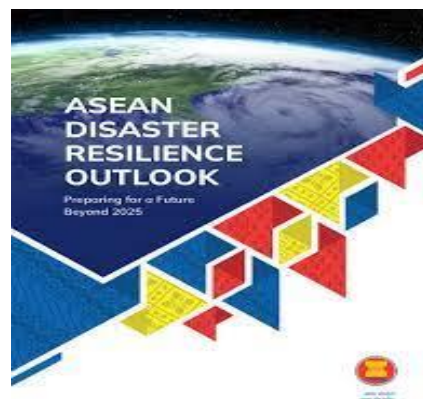


- This policy document, adopted by the 3rd AMMDM and the 4th COP to AADMER in December 2015 in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, maps the broad strategic direction and provides policy guidance on the implementation of the AADMER for the subsequent decade. The ASEAN Vision 2025 on Disaster Management aims to move towards a people-centred, people-oriented, financially sustainable, and networked approach by 2025. It also outlines **ASEAN's vision to become a Global Leader in Disaster Management by 2025.**
- The ASEAN Vision 2025 on Disaster Management identified three (3) strategic elements for the implementation of the AADMER:
 - Institutionalisation and Communications
 - Finance and Resource Mobilisation
 - Partnerships and Innovation

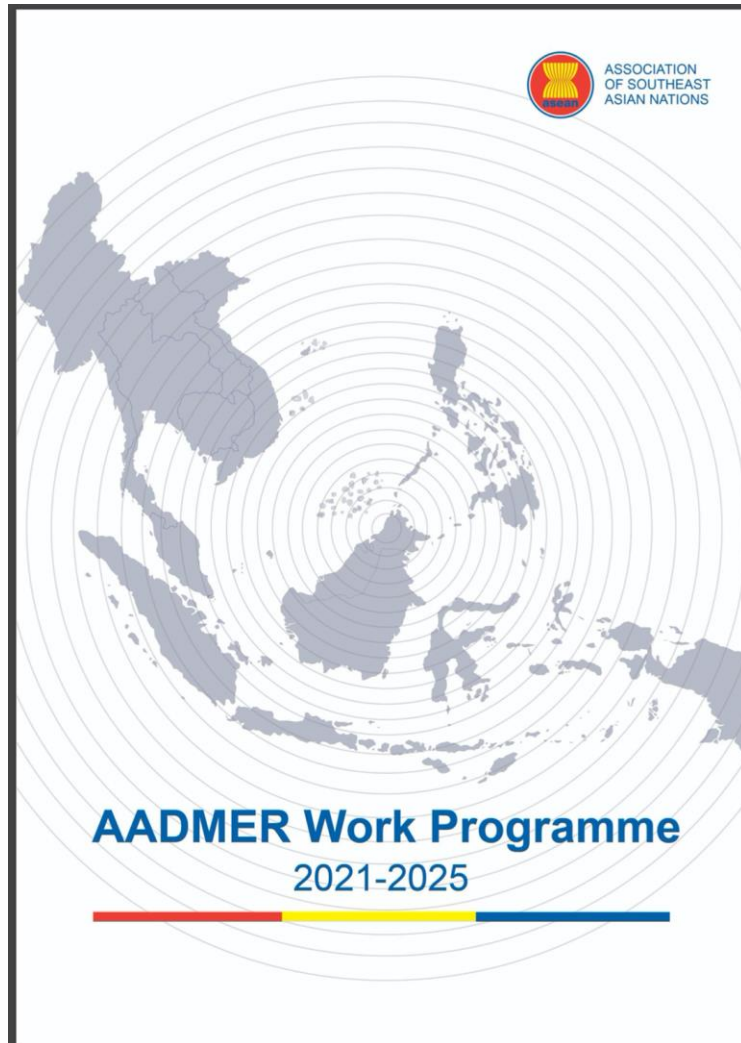

- **VISION:** A region of disaster-resilient nations, mutually assisting and complementing one another, sharing a common bond in minimising adverse effects of disasters in pursuit of safer communities and sustainable development.
- **MISSION:** To enhance and support ASEAN's disaster risk reduction and disaster management capabilities through inter-sectoral cooperation, capacity building, scalable innovation, resource mobilisation, new partnerships, and stronger coordination among ASEAN Member States
- **STRUCTURE:** 5 Priorities, 15 Sub-Priorities, 30 Outcomes, 117 Outputs
